## From the Pastor

I have some important and exciting updates to share with you. Let's start with where we stand on the staffing front. I am sad to announce we will soon be saying goodbye to Staley Lyle, who has served for the last two years as our part-time Music Time for Kids Coordinator. Staley, who first served as an intern here during her student days at Bluefield University, is moving on to become the full-time Children's Ministry Coordinator at Cornerstone Chapel in Leesburg, VA. While we never like to say goodbye to someone we love, we are honored to have been part of her journey and are pleased we can send her out to continue her service to the larger church. Meanwhile, I am excited that we currently have a strong candidate in view to succeed Staley in her role. Assuming all the details work out, we will be announcing this person very soon so they can begin their duties in early summer in preparation for the fall season of our children's music ministry. (In fact, that announcement may have happened by the time you read these words!)

Also on the staffing front, we have been in "search mode" since last fall to find our next Minister to Children & Their Families. Our search team has done all the necessary work to create an accurate job description for this position and a profile for the kind of person we need to fill this role. While this process always takes longer than we desire, we have already been introduced to more than one candidate who matches our profile. Our search team, in conjunction with the Personnel Committee, has more work to do to discern whether we have yet found the right person, but we are encouraged

by these early results. We have been told by numerous people who study such things that qualified children's ministers are increasingly hard to come by these days, so we are grateful that God has opened the door to productive conversations. With His help, we could conceivably have this role filled by the summer.

One final staffing note: Lenae Persing, who has served as our Children's Ministry Assistant for the last several years, is moving down the hall to take a position with our Weekday Early Education Center. Lenae has been an invaluable resource during this interim period in our children's ministry. She has done more behind-the-scenes work than most will ever know, so we are tremendously indebted to her for her gracious and flexible spirit, and we wish her all the best as she takes up this new role with our WEEC.

Moving on to our United For Impact Campaign, I continue to be grateful for your generous response. As of this writing, we have received pledges from 207 households totaling \$1.5 million over a three-year period. Of this pledged amount, we have already received \$559,000, which puts us well ahead of where we need to be at this point on the time-line. On top of this, we have also received an additional \$178,000 from households that did not make a pledge, so we have reason to be confident we will meet our financial goals of significantly paying down our debt and relocating our youth ministry. We are on track to potentially begin construction this calendar year!



As important as the money is, it is equally important we focus on the "United" part of this campaign. It is entirely possible we could meet or even surpass our financial goals and yet not really be changed or strengthened as a church. United For Impact is not simply a catchy slogan; it should also be a deep desire of our hearts. When we get to the end of this campaign, we need to have a stronger love for each other and a deeper desire to share our lives in service to God's kingdom. Spiritual endeavors require a spiritual focus, so we need to continually recommit ourselves to the same spirit of prayer and sacrifice that shaped the launch of this campaign.



# The Song Book of the Scripture

This is an important time because we are stepping out of routine to be with God, in recognition of his overflowing generosity to us!

For this Overflow, we are going to be focusing on "the

song book of the Scripture," the Psalms! We will spend some time reading and praying through the Psalms, as well as singing songs that are directly quoting or inspired by the Psalms. You might be surprised how many songs you know already that come directly from this book of the Bible!

#### MISSIONS RECAP

Over 120 people gathered to hear stories of how God is working through his people at Bonsack on the mission field. We heard testimonies from:

Richard and Sara Brown, who recently returned from a medical mission trip to Kenya. Through our partnership with Virginia Baptists, and along with several others around the state, they participated in a clinic that provided basic medical, dental, and vision care and provided spiritual counsel to hundreds of under-served people.

Our youth and their leaders, who recently returned from the Dominican Republic. Through our partners at Pathway Dominicana, they ministered to hundreds of children through Bible camps in three different villages, and laid flooring at a ministry center in San Pedro de Macoris.

A representative of our Sunday School ministry, who reported about partnerships that several classes have formed with one or more of our local ministry partners. We have classes that are actively participating with such organizations as Straight Street and Friendship House to do hands-on ministry right here at home.

During the first three worship services of the year, we named three priorities that should define us as a church. We are called to love God (to know), to be in community with each other (to grow), and to serve others (to go). Be on the lookout for upcoming opportunities for how you can partner with others to serve our neighbors – at home, across our state, and around the world!









#### SUNDAY SCHOOL SPOTLIGHT

The Sunday School ministry continues to grow and we're excited to witness the Holy Spirit move in our groups as we pursue our four core values: 1) learn and obey God's Word, 2) invite others, 3) form deeper friendships, and 4) engage in service.

#### Learn and Obey God's Word

Bible study is a key piece of our weekly Sunday School gathering. This May, many of our groups are wrapping up a 6-month study of Genesis, where we've seen how God sovereignly works His gracious plan even through flawed people. Other groups are studying discipleship within the church, Exodus, Acts, and the Minor Prophets. Sunday School provides an opportunity for us to study the Bible in an interactive format, where we can ask questions and share ideas.

#### **Invite Others**

After church on April 7th, about 60 leaders gathered for our quarterly Sunday School Leader Connection. Our focus this time was "Building Connection," and we discussed this quotation from John Stott:

"Thus the very purpose of [Christ's] selfgiving on the cross was not just to save isolated individuals, and so perpetuate their loneliness, but to create a new community whose members would belong to Him, love one another, and eagerly serve the world."

At Bonsack, the Sunday School ministry helps to get us out of our isolated individualism and plugged into community. We talked about the epidemic of loneliness in our nation

right now, the lack of belonging that the dechurched feel, and how Bonsack faces a unique opportunity as 691 homes are planned for construction in our immediate area in the upcoming years. As new people come into our building, will we welcome them into our groups and help them to plug in and find belonging?

Warren Strickland, a new member here at Bonsack, shares his experience:

"Sue and I were in the lobby outside the CLC one morning soon after we began visiting. We must have looked lost when a church member approached us asking if we needed assistance. We told him we were looking for Sunday School classes. He told us about an 8:30am class he attended and where it was located. A couple weeks later

we decided to visit that class and were warmly welcomed as we entered. It is a rather small class, and the demographic of its members fits us perfectly. We are certainly glad he offered that assistance to us. Previously, we had visited an 11am class where we were warmly welcomed as well. However, the 8:30am time fits our schedule much better. We feel blessed to have visited two such classes that made us feel so welcome to the church."

#### Form Deeper Friendships

This year, several Sunday School groups have chosen to partner with each other for fellowship and service





projects. Older and younger groups are encouraged to partner with each other to help us get out of our generational box and gain the perspective of befriending someone in a different season of life. "A Deeper Faith" and "Roots 2:7" are two partner groups who recently enjoyed a Sunday morning fellowship together.

#### **Engage in Service**

Many of our Sunday School groups have also adopted a mission for the year with the plan to give, pray, and serve that specific ministry. Whether it's providing cleaning supplies for Straight Street or visiting Friendship House, our Sunday School members are on the move.

Louise Hundley shares her experience coordinating service projects with the adopted mission Care Portal:

"There are now three Sunday School classes actively involved in Care Portal, a ministry dedicated to supporting families to keep children out of foster care. In the last six weeks, we have provided food, gift cards for gas and groceries, a bed, a humidifier, and a high chair to families in need. We are blessed to be the hands, feet, and heart of Jesus to children and their families in our community."

If you're new to Bonsack, or if you've been attending for years but haven't

found a group yet, this summer would be a great time to jump in!


## **Women's Ministry**
