# **From the Pastor**

Suppose you are a farmer. Suppose that you are the true owner of all the resources that go into the farm. You own the land, the equipment, the barn, the silo, and the seed, so you are free to operate this farm any way you see fit. One day you decide you want to break from normal convention and change the way you manage the farm. Everybody else follows the boring pattern of planting their seeds in the early spring. This means they must work their fields during the heat of the summer in preparation for a fall harvest. You, however, have other ideas. You want to spend your summer at the beach, so you decide to postpone planting your seeds until the fall. That way you can work the fields during the winter, when it is too cold to do anything "fun," all in preparation for harvesting your crops in the spring.

It sounds like a great idea until you try it. That's when you discover that the cycle of the seasons is such that the crops don't grow during the winter months. The shorter days and the colder temperatures simply won't allow it. You can protest to the media that you have no harvest in the spring; you can demand a government investigation into why you have been treated so unfairly; you can sue the local meteorologists for not giving you the forecast you need, but nothing will change the outcome. If you want a successful harvest, then you must work in sync with the rhythm of the seasons. Of course, even this is no guarantee. Drought, pests, invasive weeds, and countless other risks might keep you from reaping a bountiful harvest in any given year, but the reason everybody else plants their seed in the spring is because this is the pattern God has baked into the creation. It is how the world works.

The Bible refers to this as wisdom. Wisdom is the ability and the willingness to live our lives in sync with the rhythm and the order God has established. Practically, morally, and spiritually, our lives will "work" better if we adhere to this pattern rather than fight against it. This doesn't mean there is no room for creativity and innovation. It does mean that over time, those who align themselves with the patterns of truth God has revealed will be more likely to flourish in all the ways that God has intended.

The good news is that we don't have to look too far or acquire highly specialized knowledge to know what these patterns are, because God has revealed them to us. As the Apostle Paul makes clear in Romans 1, we see initial evidence of them in the creation. More importantly, we see His divine order revealed in Scripture, which makes plain what He intends for his people. Ultimately, we see His wisdom most fully on display in the person and the



work of Jesus Christ. According to the opening lines of John's gospel, Jesus is the Word, which translates the Greek word, Logos. In the Greek language, Logos is the ordering principle that lies behind all things. As Colossians 1:17 puts it, "He is before all things, and in him all things hold together." Jesus is God's wisdom made flesh.

Many of us enter the new year with goals to pursue or changes to make, which is all well and good, but the most important change we can make is to put Christ at the center of all things. It is by worshiping, serving, and obeying him that our lives have the best chance of flourishing, because only then will we truly be in sync with God's revealed wisdom. Let's pursue him together and see what kind of harvest he has in store!

# **Better Love Date Night**

With Drs. Les and Leslie Parrott

With three school-aged kids, date nights are few these days, and even finding time for conversation can be challenging. During the day? Too busy. At night? Too tired. Can anyone relate?

We've been married for almost sixteen years, and we discovered from year one that marriage takes work. A strong, healthy marriage doesn't happen naturally, not with two sinners involved, the world's message inundating us, plus spiritual attack—in other words, the world, the flesh, and the devil all against us. Marriage is something you have to work for, fight for.

So there we sat at Cabo Fish Taco with a pile of papers in front of us, because we can be old school and print things. (I know a lot of people can relate to that!) It's hard to have these conversations without conflict, at least!—in the middle of a busy routine. Coming just after Valentine's Day, we'll enjoy a special night together as bestselling authors Drs. Les and Leslie Parrott help us experience better love and healthier relationships. Drs. Les and Leslie (yes, they have the same name, and they both have doctorates!) bring to the table not only a strong faith and biblical insights, but also backgrounds in counseling and psychology that equip them with practical relational tools.

# **Kenya** Mission Trip

Sodzo International is an organization based in Maua, Kenya, and they have been a mission partner of Bonsack since 2018. Their mission is to advance the well-being of the world's most vulnerable children. They envision a world where all children possess the opportunity to discover and actualize their Godgiven potential. Sodzo confronts the problem of child homelessness through direct reintegration, a rescue center, and family strengthening.

Sodzo has a nearly 80% success rate with the children that they minister to and have made an incredible impact on thousands of families in north-central Kenya.

This September, we are returning on a mission trip to serve alongside our Kenyan brothers and sisters as they share the love of Christ with some of the most vulnerable people in the world. The trip is open to all adults. While the exact work that we will do is somewhat dependent on the make-up of the team, we will be interacting with children and adults. There will be opportunity for ministry and teaching as well as physical projects. This trip is a great opportunity to serve God through serving the people of Kenya and it is an opportunity to grow deeper in your faith.

Dates: September 14 – 22 Cost: Approximately \$2,500 Applications will be due at the end of February. The first meeting will be in March.

Faith and Fellowship, led by Louise Nunn and Greg Stidham, initiated a variety of service projects in 2023, helping Teen Challenge, providing snacks for children in need at a local elementary school, and adopting a family for Christmas. The Believers group also adopted a family for Christmas.

**PURE**, our Special Needs Adults led by Charlotte Creasy and Jill Winston, love to write encouraging cards.

**Peace and Joy**, led by Mike Bryant, raised \$850 for the Friendship House Christmas Toy Store. Friendship House is a partner ministry of Bonsack Baptist, and their Christmas Toy Store sells new toys at deeply discounted prices to families in need. Funds raised through the toy store provide scholarships for their after-school program.

Did you see apple butter for sale around the church this fall? **Legacy Builders**, led by Jay Hipes, got together to make 59 gallons of apple butter, a twelve-hour project at the Munceys' home that they describe as "...fellowship and fun, with a purpose. We knew we wanted to do something to minister to others, and we love being able to raise money for a ministry while enjoying spending time together as a group." The Legacy Builders raised \$2,319 for the youth mission trip to serve Pathway Dominicana in the Dominican Republic!

This list is just a sampling of so many fundraisers and service projects initiated by

our Bonsack community. We are putting into practice Hebrews 10:24—"let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds."
